

Growth Group Questions  
For the week of October 6, 2013  
*Koinonia: Having the Time of Your Life*

*Icebreaker:* Tell something funny, amusing, or entertaining about your summer.

READ TEXT: Acts 2:42. Luke 24:13-32. Emphasis on *fellowship*. (Koinonia--"sharing what one has in common". Involves joint participation in mutually beneficial relationships. The same bond that ties us to Jesus ties us to one another...sense of intimacy with and in Christ.)

1. What is your first thought about their being "devoted" to "fellowship" (Koinonia)? Why was this so important to them and perhaps not to Christians today?
  
2. AARP published the top regrets of the dying. One was that they wished they had spent less time working...and more time with friends. [Could this reflect the longing for the *koinonia* Jesus designed us for?] If you were to die next week and end "the time of your life", what regrets would you have? How are you doing in *koinonia*?
  
3. In I Corinthians 10:20, Paul writes of partaking in *koinonia* with demons. Can Christians do this today? If so, how? Is life neutral, or are we driven to either godly or evil *koinonia*?
  
4. In his three years of ministry, Jesus walked many hundreds of miles with his disciples. In Luke 24:17, Jesus asks an important question of some disciples walking. In your life, how would you answer him? How can you experience more of what happened in Luke 24:13-32?
